THE COURT HEREBY ORDERS THE FOLLOWING:

1. CUSTODY

“Exhibit A” – Visitation Schedule

If the parties cannot agree on specific visitation, the _____ shall have the right to visitation according to the schedule below. To resolve any conflicts in the visitation provided under this schedule, the holiday visitation provided under paragraph (b) shall have priority over the weekend and summer visitation in paragraphs (a) and (c).

- (a) Weekends – The first and third weekends of every month, from Friday at 6:00 p.m. until Sunday at 6:00 p.m. The first and third weekends shall be defined as the weekends containing the first and third Fridays of the month.
- (b) Holidays – The children shall spend holidays with each parent on the following schedule:

(c) Summer Vacation - _____ weeks during the children’s summer vacation from school. However, if none of the children are enrolled in school, then summer visitation shall be taken during the months of June, July, and August, until such time as one of the children begins to attend school. The weeks may be taken consecutively or non-consecutively, but shall be taken in increments of at least seven (7) consecutive days. The parent with visitation shall give written notice of the chosen weeks to the other parent on or before March 1st (so that both parties will have ample time to make camp and child care arrangements for the summer).
